**Robert Currie** is an Associate Professor and Director of the Law & Technology Institute at the Schulich School of Law, Dalhousie University, where he teaches International Criminal Law, International Advocacy, Evidence and Law & Technology. Professor Currie is a specialist and consultant in the area of international and transnational criminal law, and has published numerous articles and book chapters in this field. His recent book, *International & Transnational Criminal Law* was cited by the Supreme Court of Canada and was short-listed for the Walter Owen Book Prize. He was a co-author of the leading Canadian international law textbook, *International Law: Chiefly As Interpreted and Applied in Canada*, (7<sup>th</sup> ed.) and is currently a co-investigator in a four-year SSHRC-funded project on extraterritorial jurisdiction. In 2008, Professor Currie received the Dalhousie Law Students' Society and Alumni Association Award for Excellence in Teaching. He is a Commissioner of the Nova Scotia Law Reform Commission, a member of the Board of Directors of the Canadian IT Law Association, and a member of the Canadian Council on International Law.
